HOW TO BREAK INTO ARBITRATION: USEFUL RESOURCES FOR STUDENTS AND YOUNG PRACTITIONERS

There are excellent resources for students and young practitioners interested in arbitration, but they are scattered across the Web. This list is intended to be a one-stop detailed reference, and includes links to young arbitration groups; arbitration websites; publications and podcasts; moots; Who's Who lists; law firm newsletters; law schools with specialized international arbitration programs; arbitration blogs; and online discussion groups.

The list focuses on international arbitration, not more general dispute resolution, and we have limited inclusion accordingly. The list cannot be exhaustive, although we have tried hard. We apologize in advance for inadvertent omissions, and we invite any organization to contact us about inclusion of inadvertently omitted links.

This resource is the product of a collaborative effort between students of the Georgetown International Arbitration Society (GIAS) and members of the DC Bar International Dispute Resolution Committee. Arbitral Women

Anyone may take advantage of the website for <u>ArbitralWomen</u>, but women would particularly benefit by becoming members. In addition to providing mentoring, the group holds networking meetings and social gatherings, often on the sidelines of other arbitration conferences. Arbitral Women have also just established an Arbitral Women Award, which aims to support young lawyers from developing countries and promote the advancement of women in arbitration and other forms of dispute resolution.

Publications, Podcasts and Websites

<u>Global Arbitration Review</u> - You can sign up for free "breaking news" e-mail alerts from Global Arbitration Review, a bi-monthly journal, as well as subscribing.

Investment Treaty News - This periodic e-mail briefing covers cases and treaty developments in the area of investment treaty arbitration. It is a service of the International Institute for Sustainable Development (IISD). IISD is an NGO that is often very critical of the system of investment and trade treaties, including investment arbitration. Its weekly update is an excellent (if mildly biased) source of news.

<u>Investment Arbitration Reporter</u> is a "by subscription" specialized news publication tracking developments in the area of international investment law. You can sign up for free "breaking news" email alerts.

At <u>**Transnational Dispute Management**</u>, an online journal, you can sign up for free e-mail alerts and news <u>digests</u>. In addition, you can learn about OGEMID and YOUNG-OGEMID, very active e-mail discussion lists. YOUNG-OGEMID is aimed in particular at young professionals. You can subscribe to TDM for a fee, but it may be available through your law library. Participation on OGEMID requires a TDM subscription, but participation on Young-OGEMID is not similarly restricted.

You can sign up for Arbitrage-ADR, the French arbitration discussion list.

IBA - If you are a member of the International Bar Association, you can access World Arbitration News, a LexisNexis search updated daily, from the Arbitration Committee's website.

<u>AIA</u> - The Belgian-based Association for International Arbitration has a monthly newsletter, In Touch.

<u>Chartered Institute of Arbitrators</u> - The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators has a Young Members' Group, but it is only open to qualified members of CIArb. You can join as an associate, which is not the same as a member, but Associate-level participation is being rethought right now to make it more accessible to young lawyers. The CIArb runs a number of easily accessible London-based events. CIArb has a number of regional branches, some of which also have their own websites. For example, the North American Branch website is <u>here</u>.

Institute for Transnational Arbitration - The ITA publishes "News and Notes," a quarterly newsletter with a regularly updated Scoreboard of Adherence to Transnational Arbitration Treaties, and World Arbitration and Mediation Review.

Moots and other Hands-on Training

Two moots focus on investment treaty arbitration - <u>The Frankfurt Investment Arbitration</u> <u>Moot</u> ("FIAC") and the <u>FDI Moot</u>.

The International Maritime Law Arbitration Moot

Moot Madrid occurs in the summer and is conducted entirely in Spanish.

National Law School of India University International Arbitration Moot Court <u>Competition</u>

The Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot – The Willem C. Vis International Commercial Arbitration Moot is the premier arbitration competition for law students. Year 2009-10 marked the seventeenth year for <u>Vienna</u> and the 7th year in <u>Hong</u> <u>Kong</u>. Teams from law schools from all countries are eligible. The Vis Moot involves a dispute arising out of a contract of sale between two countries that are party to the United Nations Convention on Contracts for the International Sale of Goods. The contract provides that any dispute that might arise is to be settled by arbitration in "Danubia", a country that has enacted the UNCITRAL Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration and is a party to the Convention on the Recognition and Enforcement of Foreign Arbitral Awards. The arbitral rules to be applied rotate yearly among the arbitration rules of co-sponsors of the Moot. Participants in the Vis can later become members of the <u>Moot Alumni Association</u> (the MAA). The MAA publishes the Vindobona Journal, provides members of the Board of the CISG review, sponsors conferences, has observer status at UNCITRAL for the ongoing revisions to the UNCITRAL Arbitration Rules and throws great parties.

<u>The Foundation for International Arbitration Advocacy</u> runs a series of hands-on advocacy training workshops in Switzerland, on topics including witness examination, cross-examination, oral argument and written advocacy.

The Centre of Arbitration and Conciliation of the Chamber of Commerce of Bogotá offers a Specialized Course on International Arbitration as part of its <u>School of International</u> <u>Arbitration</u>. The Specialized Course on International Arbitration is aimed at Latin American lawyers between the ages of 30 and 45 years with an interest and experience in the area of international commercial arbitration.

La Competencia Internacional de Arbitraje Comercial is an international arbitration moot competition organized jointly by the law schools of the University of Buenos Aires (Argentina) and the Universidad del Rosario (Colombia). Almost thirty teams from different countries (including Argentina, Colombia, Perú, Chile and Uruguay, among others) participated in 2009's competition, and the organizers expect the event will continue growing. The competition is similar to the Vis Moot. The written memoranda and the oral hearings are conducted in Spanish.
