A lawyer's beauty contest: which path to choose between commercial and investment arbitration?

Participants in this session will present a mock 'beauty contest' between law firms after the presentation of a potential case by a client. The client will describe a situation in which a dispute with a government agency over its business operations can lend itself to either a commercial arbitration or an investment treaty arbitration. The client will seek advice in particular relating to whether it should consider selecting either commercial arbitration or treaty arbitration, or instituting parallel arbitration proceedings. Two lawyers, from two different firms, will compete for the client's business and in the course of their respective pitches, will propose opposite advice regarding the arbitration path to be chosen and the consequences for the client.
